KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Janne Liburd (University of Southern Denmark)

Prof. Dr. Janne Liburd is Professor of Tourism and Director of the Centre for Tourism, Innovation and Culture at the University of Southern Denmark. She has developed the field of tourism co-design, and is an expert in sustainability, collaboration, protected areas, and tourism higher education. Janne served as Chairman of the Board, the UNESCO World Heritage Wadden Sea National Park in Denmark (2015–2023). October 1, 2025 she will be Distinguished Serra Húnter Professor at the University of Girona.

Maria Gravari-Barbas (Université Paris 1 – Panthéon-Sorbonne)

Dr. Maria Gravari-Barbas has a degree in Architecture and Urban Design (University of Athens, 1985) and a PhD in Geography and Planning (Paris IV – Sorbonne, 1991). She was Fellow at the Urban Program of Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, USA (1990). She is the Director of the EIREST, a multidisciplinary research team dedicated to tourism studies, with main focus on cultural heritage, development, and urban-tourism evolutions. Since 2009 she is the director of the UNESCO Chair of Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne University and the coordinator of the UNITWIN network 'Tourism, Culture, Development'. From 2008 to 2017 she was the director of the Institute for Research and High Studies on Tourism (Institut de Recherches et d'Etudes Supérieures du Tourisme, IREST) of Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne University. Her published works include: A research Agenda for Heritage Tourism, Elgar (2020), Le patrimoine mondial, Mise en tourisme, mise en images, L'Harmattan (2020), Lieux ordinaires, avant et après le tourisme, PUCA (2018), Tourism and Gentrification in Contemporary Metropolises. International Perspectives, Routledge (2017), World Heritage Sites and Tourism. Global and Local Relations, Routledge (2017).



Konstantina Zerva (Universitat de Girona)

Dr. Konstantina Zerva is a Professor of Marketing and Market Investigation at the University of Girona, Spain. She received her PhD from the Autonomous University of Barcelona and her PhD thesis was related to the social exchanges regarding music consumption. She has published in indexed journals, such as Tourism Management and Tourism Geographies. Her current research interests include the analysis of niche tourism market segments, gender and mobility, social marketing and theories of social exchange, through the use of qualitative methods of data analysis.

WI-FI INSTRUCTIONS

Eduroam

The University of Girona participates in the initiative by giving access to its own users and to the users of the other institutions participating in eduroam.

How to use eduroam at the UdG?

- If your organization is adhered to the eduroam initiative and you have configured your device to use eduroam, you only have to connect to the Wi-Fi network named: eduroam.

To find out if your institution is affiliated, you can check the link <https://eduroam.org/where/> or ask directly at your organisation's IT services.

- If your organisation is a member of the eduroam initiative but you do not have your device configured to use eduroam, you must configure it. To do this, you need to follow your institution's eduroam setup guide.
- If your institution is **not** a member of the **eduroam initiative**, you will need to register with the University of Girona in order to access Wi-Fi.

We advise you to register before coming to the University of Girona so that when you arrive you already have the procedure done.

Once registration is done, you will get Wi-Fi access for 7 days. If the congress lasts more than a week, you can renew Wi-Fi access without having to register again. The following section explains how to register at the University of Girona.




